## The Croatian Conflict over Pensions

Dear colleague,

I am writing to you to express the support of industriAll Europe to the Croatian trade unions in their struggle for a fair pension reform. Our federation organises 7 million manufacturing workers across Europe. We stand firmly on the side of the trade unions also because **retirement in dignity** matters to all Europeans.

We find it unacceptable that **the Croatian Government has refused to negotiate its pension reform** with the national trade unions. Refusing to discuss alternative proposals – that is not acceptable in a democracy and it is not acceptable in the European Union.

So Croatian unions are rightly **taking to the streets to protest.** IndustriAll Europe fully understands their actions. The advice the European Commission has given in this respect could cause **harm to workers who need early retirement** for health reasons.

In Croatia and throughout the EU we need a guarantee that a good job gives a decent life and a decent pension for a well-deserved retirement after many years of work.

We call on the Croatian Government to change its reform, to negotiate with trade unions for fair pensions for all workers in Croatia.
